TIMELINE – START NOW!

JANUARY:

- ✓ Meet with your high school counselor and your family to discuss whether a pre-college program is right for you.
- ✓ Visit the Joyce Ivy Foundation website: www.joyceivyfoundation.org to read what previous Summer Scholars have to say about their experiences.
- ✓ Begin to research pre-college programs and courses.

FEBRUARY:

- ✓ Decide on the pre-college program you wish to attend. Complete and submit the college's program application.
- ✓ Submit your online Joyce Ivy Foundation Summer Scholar application.

MARCH:

- ✓ Mail or fax all supporting documents to complete your Joyce Ivy Foundation Summer Scholar application.
- ✓ All elements of your application must be received by the Joyce Ivy Foundation no later than March 16, 2009.

APRIL:

- ✓ You will be notified of the Joyce Ivy Foundation's scholarship decision by April 30, 2009.
