Under the direction of Frances Nan, we coordinated over ten virtual college admission and financial aid related webinars throughout the fall and spring. All sessions were free of charge, open to the public, and led by experts from our partner colleges and universities. As virtual events, we reached even more students, families, and educators across the Midwest.

Earlier this year, we created an Associate Board of Directors to raise awareness and support for the work and mission of the Foundation. The inaugural members are Summer Scholar alumnae who have been dedicated volunteers for years. They have already been instrumental in shaping the future direction of the Foundation with exciting ideas and energy. We also welcomed Tiffany Taylor of Clinton Township, Michigan to the Board of Directors. Tiffany has been engaged with the Foundation since she was named a Woman of Impact in 2018. 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Mission

The Joyce Ivy Foundation is a non-profit 501c3 organization committed to the academic advancement and leadership development of young women from the Midwest.

We seek to amplify the Midwestern voice on college campuses nationwide and empower talented young women from all backgrounds to elevate their aspirations during the college search process and beyond.

We take issue with the underrepresentation of female Midwestern perspectives at highly selective colleges and universities and in positions of leadership across industries, and with the undermatching of high-achieving, low-income female students in the college decision process.

We believe that talent is equally distributed in our society and that the Midwestern perspective deserves to be celebrated and shared.

We believe in the transformative power of educational experiences.

We believe in the potential of young women as leaders.

To date, the Joyce Ivy Foundation has named **972 Summer Scholars**. Our Scholars participate in pre-college summer academic programs with some of the most academically rigorous, diverse, and selective colleges and universities in the country.

Through the Joyce Ivy Foundation and our college and community based organization partnerships, each group of Summer Scholars receives nearly **half a million dollars** in financial support, making their summer program participation possible.

The Joyce Ivy Foundation hosts annual college admission events, both in-person and virtually, which bring together hundreds of educators, community leaders, college admission and financial aid professionals, high school students and their families to exchange critical information about the college admission process.

The **eighty-two 2021 Summer Scholars** hail from Michigan, Ohio, Nebraska, Missouri, Minnesota, and North Dakota; and they represent **fifty-nine** different secondary schools.

For Scholars who come from schools that calculate GPA or class rank, **57%** reported a 4.0 GPA or higher and **9** rank first or second in their high school class.

The 2021 Summer Scholars represent the most diverse cohort in Foundation history: **71%** identify as women of color, including 21 Black Scholars, 20 Asian Scholars, 9 Latina Scholars, and 8 Multiracial Scholars. **48%** are first generation to attend college and **61%** qualify for the highest level of need-based scholarship.

Beyond these tangible measures, the 2021 Scholars are curious students, bright problem solvers, passionate

artists, motivating leaders and dedicated community members.
